## NATIONAL CANCER POLICY FROM VISION TO ACTION





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For the third consecutive year, the Hellenic Association of Pharmaceutical Companies (SFEE) and its Oncology Platform held a conference dedicated to promoting a holistic approach to cancer care. This year's event, titled "National Cancer Policy: From Vision to Action," brought together key stakeholders who unanimously underscored the urgent need for cross-sector collaboration and interdisciplinary strategies. The goal is to enable Greece to develop and implement a comprehensive Action Plan for the effective prevention, management and treatment of cancer. This annual meeting has fostered an informal alliance between the state and key stakeholders, reaffirming their commitment to dialogue, cooperation, and consensus in addressing not only cancer but broader healthcare challenges as well.

During his remarks, the Minister of Health committed that this discussion **should be taken at an interministerial level, under the guidance of the Prime Minister, making clear that tackling** cancer is a priority across all areas of government policy, not just the Ministry of Health.

Participants highlighted the critical role of a robust legislative framework in promoting cancer-related policies (G. Stylios), along with **the need for a detailed roadmap to guarantee their implementation**. They stressed the necessity of defining clear objectives, timelines, and resource allocation to ensure the successful execution of these policies (K. Souliotis, N. Dedes).

A significant announcement was made by the Minister regarding **the immediate reimbursement of biomarkers**, facilitated through the establishment of a dedicated budget within EOPYY. This initiative reflects the significance of collaboration between the scientific community and decision-makers in designing policies that, over time, improve citizens' access to appropriate cancer treatments while simultaneously generating savings for the healthcare system, as evidenced in the study of Professor K. Athanasakis.

The Minister underlined the need for **Greece's digital modernization** in tackling healthcare challenges such as cancer. A commitment was made to the immediate implementation of the National Cancer Registry, which in conjunction with the Therapeutic Oncology and Hematology Protocols, will enable comprehensive monitoring of oncology and hematology patients. These interventions respond to long-standing requests from the medical community and patient associations (Z. Saridaki, E. Kourea, G. Kapetanakis). A key issue raised in the discussion was the development of appropriate mechanisms to ensure timely and equitable access for the population to innovation, whether in the diagnostic or therapeutic phases of cancer care. Equally important was the evaluation and broader integration of generics and biosimilars in cancer treatment (G. Vasilopoulos).

At the European level, the necessity of a holistic approach to cancer is highlighted by the European Commission's "Europe's Beating Cancer Plan<sup>1</sup>." This initiative prioritizes equal access for all patients to prevention programs, early diagnosis, innovative treatments, and the benefits of personalized medicine. In parallel, the European Parliament's decision **to establish a distinct Public Health Committee** demonstrates the significance of strengthening institutional frameworks in the face of emerging health threats<sup>2</sup> (N. Papandreou).

Greece has made considerable progress in the fight against cancer. Initiatives such as early diagnosis programs for breast and colorectal cancer, the introduction of evidence-based therapeutic protocols, and the development of cancer registries are noteworthy. However, particular attention is needed in policies targeting early diagnosis and treatment of pediatric cancer (D. Doganis, D. Boumpas), early detection of high-mortality cancers such as lung cancer (E. Zervas), and the **field of palliative care**. On this front, the Minister announced plans to establish a specialized unit for palliative care in collaboration with the Hellenic Anti-Cancer Society.

Fighting cancer is a collective responsibility: one that calls upon all sectors of society. By setting the common goal of addressing this public health threat, all stakeholders— the scientific and medical community, policymakers, and the pharmaceutical industry— can work together to create the necessary conditions for its successful realization.
